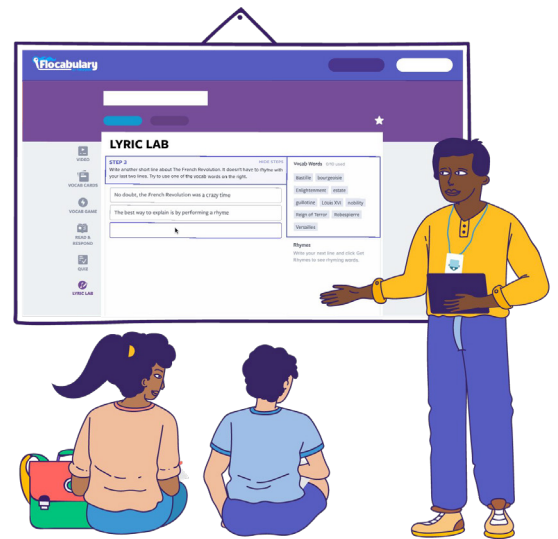




Accelerate learning through rigor and rhythm

2. Practice Bloom's philosophy on "remembering"

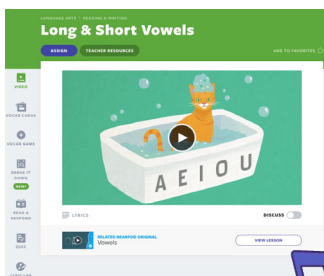
Mimicking a beat or a rhyme can be associated with Bloom's Taxonomy philosophy on remembering. The beat supports the repetition of a pattern, while remembering a rhyme involves recalling information conveyed through the song's lyrics.

3. Improve student academic achievement through social and emotional growth
